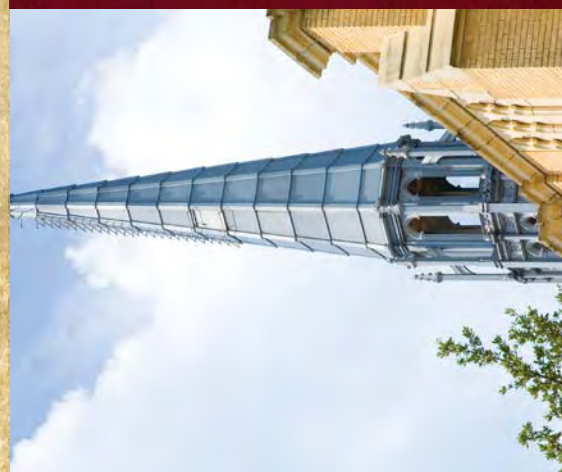

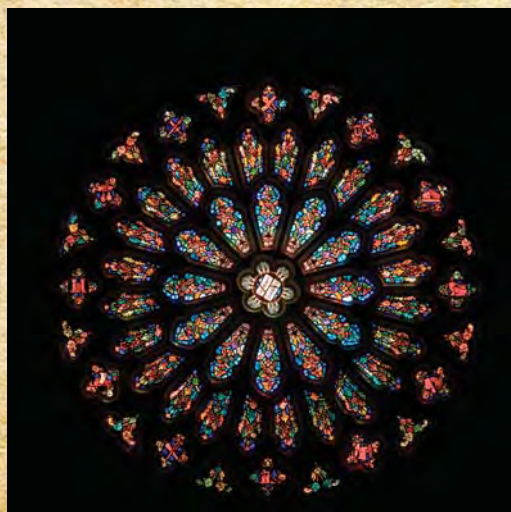

Yoon-Mi Lim occupies the Albert L. Travis Chair and is Associate Professor of Organ in the School of Church Music at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Fort Worth, where she teaches courses in Organ Literature,

Organ Pedagogy, Service Playing, and Applied Organ. She was the first-prize winner of the National Young Artists Competition in Organ Performance, sponsored by the American Guild of Organists, which was held during the 47th National Convention of the Guild in Los Angeles, California, 2004.

Bradley Welch, Organist

Bradley Welch is Director of Music and Arts/Organist at Dallas' Highland Park United Methodist Church. Dr. Welch is the 2003 First Place winner of the Dallas International Organ Competition and is hailed as a "world-class

virtuoso" and "an expert at defining darks, lights, shadows, and colors." He is in demand as a recitalist, concerto soloist, and collaborative artist. *Bradley Welch Plays at Broadway Baptist Church* is his first recording and the first solo recording of Broadway's Cliburn organ. He performs approximately 20 concerts annually.

A native of Picayune, Mississippi, Patrick Scott holds a Bachelor of Music degree in Organ Performance from Birmingham-Southern College and a Master of Music degree in Organ Performance and Sacred Music from the University of Texas at

Since 1999, he has been working full-time as organist and choirmaster at the Konstantin-Basilika Trier. From 2001 until 2008 he taught organ improvisation at the Musikhochschule Cologne. Martin Bambauer has

toured many European countries and the United States as organist and conductor and has made numerous CD recordings.

Washington D.C. The recipient of the coveted William Fulbright Grant, Mr. Laube spent the 2010-2011 academic year studying with Michel Bouvard at the Conservatoire à Rayonnement Régional de Toulouse as a candidate for the Prix de Spécialisé. Upcoming and recent performances by Mr. Laube include major venues in the United States and Europe.

Bruce Neswick, Organist

Concert organist Bruce Neswick is one of America's major talents in the field of organ performance and is especially noted for his superb ability as an improvisateur.
