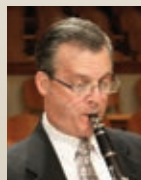

Raúl Ramírez's career as an artist of international stature was confirmed when he was appointed, at the age of 27, as the first Organist-in-Residence at the Auditorio Nacional de Musica in Madrid, Spain's National Concert Hall. He is now a full time concert organist with a busy global schedule which takes him to major festivals and concert halls around the world. Raul's special appeal to audiences owes much to his thrilling performances, given entirely from memory, which combine dazzling virtuosity with great expressive power.
